Simple	<p>Subject + Verb (base form/third person plural) + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: Rajesh eats bread and butter.</p>	<p>Subject + Verb in Past Tense + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: Nupur went to the supermarket yesterday.</p>	<p>Subject + will/shall + Verb (base form) + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: I will write articles on different topics.</p>
Continuous	<p>Subject + Helping Verb (am/is/are) + Main Verb + ing + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: Students are going to school.</p>	<p>Subject + Helping Verb (was/were) + Main Verb + ing + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: It was snowing today.</p>	<p>Subject + will be/shall be + Verb (base form) + ing + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: I will be waiting here for three hours by six o'clock.</p>
Perfect	<p>Subject + Helping Verb (have/has) + Past Participle of the Main Verb + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: She has lived here all her life.</p>	<p>Subject + Helping Verb (had) + Past Participle of the Main Verb + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: She had met him before the party.</p>	<p>Subject + will have/shall have + Past Participle of the Main Verb + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: I will have dressed up by the time you reach home.</p>
Perfect Continuous	<p>Subject + Have/Has + Been + Verb + ing + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: I have been working on this project for a week.</p>	<p>Subject + Had + Been + Verb + ing + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: He had been drinking milk out of the carton when Mom walked into the kitchen.</p>	<p>Subject + will have been + Verb (base form) + ing + Rest of the Sentence</p> <p>Example: I will have been waiting here for three hours by six o'clock.</p>
